Examples of public engagement (as reported to us by the ASB Team, using their words):

“Spoke with a few people whilst visiting the community centre on Forstal Road, they all love the area and are very proud about how peaceful it can be.”

“We spoke with Jackie, a local resident. She reported that the area is generally quiet except that a couple of weeks ago kids were shooting at squirrels using catapults. She did not have full information, but she confirmed that the police were called”.

“We spoke with Luke, ex-Marine. He reported that this area is very quiet, and everything is secured with CCTV. He also assured us that no one can misbehave around the area, or they would kick them off. When asked about the kids that used catapults to shoot animals, he expressed a lack of knowledge of the issue while appreciated our efforts and cause”.

“I spoke with a older couple asking them about the area and they told me they had recently been harassed by a few teenagers throwing bottles whilst riding their bikes. I asked if they reported it to the police, but they didn't know whether they were gonna help”.
