



Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council Anti-Social Behaviour Enforcement Team

Report for October 2025



During October 2025 the ASB Enforcement Team have visited 208 locations across the borough and have engaged with 92 businesses, 280 members of the public, 15 groups of young people and identified 4 instances of flytipping.

They have spent 676 hours in the borough during October (four individual staff members covering five days). On Halloween we were able to ensure that an additional team was in place to focus on known hot spot areas.

Some examples of public engagement (as reported to us by the ASB Team, using their words):

“Ed lives locally and said nothing antisocial happening here, he is satisfied and enjoys living here, he appreciated us being there and mentioned that this should be the case for other streets around here too”.

“We talked to Mark, he is a local resident there and he works from home, so he spends most of his time at home. He is concerned about some cars driving around this area very fast and they use streets around here too multiple times a day. The neighbours are concerned about the safety, but they do not have any evidence gathered yet. I have provided our email to him so that once the evidence is there, he can share it with us”.

“Visited Coop there (Walderslade), talked to the store supervisor (Melissa), she said despite being busy, this area is peaceful and nothing ASB issues here”.
