

## Parish Council Monthly Update

## AYLESFORD, ECCLES, BLUEBELL HILL, WALDERSLADE JANUARY 22

Theft-Halfords, Mills road, Aylesford. A male entered the store and stole a scooter worth £100. He was wearing a David Beckham head band and left in a vehicle nearby. CCTV was available.

Theft of vehicle- Howick close, Aylesford. A resident parked his works vehicle on his drive overnight only to discover in the morning it had been stolen. The vehicle was full of wine and some bottles costing over £100.

Shoplifting- Sainsburys, Aylesford. A male wearing a tag and being monitored was seen by security de-tagging bottles of champagne. Security restrained the male who later was arrested.

Theft from motor vehicle- Richard corben way, Aylesford. Multiple works vans were broken into by damaging the locks. It is not known what has been stolen. A ripped off number plate nearby was found with fingerprints.

Criminal damage- Bull lane, Eccles. A resident called to say someone had fired a catapult at her window causing it to smash. No one was seen in the area.

Vehicle theft- Oaksdene, Walderslade. A caravan was stolen in Walderslade. A report was made and investigated.
