## Aylesford-Eccles-Bluebell Hill-Walderslade NOVEMBER 22

Mcdonalds-Aylesford. A male entered the drive-thru and threatened staff about his meal. He also was racist towards staff. CCTV was available.

Station road, Aylesford. A male called police when he saw a male lying on the ground in Station road. The male then got up and was unstable, believed to be drunk. There was concern he would walk into traffic.

Doctors surgery-Admiral moore drive, RBLV, Aylesford. A male patient entered the surgery and started banging on the desk. He said he would knock doors down and banged his fist on the desk. This was due to him believing he had received the wrong medication.

Mcdonalds- Aylesford. A male taxi driver entered the drive-thru with passengers and started being aggressive when told to wait in the car park for his meal. Police arrived and CCTV was available.

Royal British Legion Village, Aylesford. A female found an ipad with medical information. The tablet was left on the ground. This was handed in to the police station.

Poundstretcher, Aylesford. Three males entered the store and started being abusive. They were causing distress for other customers. When police arrived they had already left the store.
